

OBJECTIVES ACHIEVED

CCB has continued to be the leading NGO network and voice of the civil society in the Baltic Sea Region. CCB continues to be seen as a relevant actor, proactive but also strong defender of the EU policies and environmental law.

Activities linked to illegal forestry, illegal fishing and discarding, dumping of plastic waste, plans for ill-advised projects like gas pipelines, canals and poor or nonexisting handling of manure and toxic waste has been highlighted by CCB.











CCB has strengthened his work in addressing **>** plastic and microplastic pollution in the Baltic Sea Region, especially through raising awareness campaigns among civil society, and will continue to tackle the plastic issue in the coming plan of actions.

To show where civil society stands on the progress for a cleaner Baltic Sea, largely disappointed in the leadership of their own Member States, the CCB network presented the declaration ▶ "We are the Baltic: Civil Society Declaration on Ecosystem Health of the Baltic Sea" during the side-event at HELCOM Ministerial Meeting in Brussels, key event during 2018.

Moreover, 2018 marked significant changes in BSAC due largely to CCB's effort both in securing a new Chair, and in building collaboration as **Chair of the Working Group on Ecosystems Based Fisheries Management**.

ACTIVITIES & OUTCOMES




In 2018, CCB has continued to use internal experts to either represent the network at meetings or to develop ▶ joint statements, ▶ publications, form priorities and plan. CCB has also participated in relevant science conferences, workshops and benchmark ▶ events.

Key arenas are HELCOM, BALTFISH, BSAC, MSCG, IUCN, as well as expert groups such as ASCOBANS, Jastarnia. CCB has continuous contact with DG Mare as well as DG Environment staff, with EP and MEP offices, primarily Baltic representatives.




